Please STAND as the sacristy bell rings, to sing the entrance hymn:

Jesus lives! Thy terrors now can, O Death, no more appal us; Jesus lives! By this we know thou, O grave, canst not enthral us. Alleluya!

Jesus lives! Henceforth is death but the gate of life immortal; This shall calm our trembling breath when we pass its gloomy portal. Alleluya!

Jesus lives! For us he died; then, alone to Jesus living, Pure in heart may we abide, glory to our Saviour giving. Alleluya!

Jesus lives! Our hearts know well nought from us his love shall sever; Life, nor death, nor powers of hell tear us from his keeping ever. Alleluya!

The choir sings Kyrie Eleison:

SILENT PRAYER

We have lived by our own strength, and not by the power of your resurrection. In your mercy, forgive us.

Lord, hear us and help us.

We have lived by the light of our own eyes, as faithless and not believing. In your mercy, forgive us.

We have lived for this world alone, and doubted our home in heaven. In your mercy, forgive us.

Lord, hear us and help us.

The President pronounces the Absolution:

The choir sings Gloria in Excelsis:

Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, Almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory:

Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world; have mercy on us. You are seated at the right hand of the Father, receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

In silence, we pray.

Silent prayer; then the President prays the Collect for the Day.

Let us pray that we may walk the risen life of Christ in glory.

Almighty God,
who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ
have overcome death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life:
grant that, as by your grace going before us
you put into our minds good desires,
so by your continual help
we may bring them to good effect;
through Jesus Christ our risen Lord,

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

A reading from Acts.

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, 'Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?' Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, 'I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, "Get up, Peter; kill and eat." But I replied, "By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth." But a second time the voice answered from heaven, "What God has made clean, you must not call profane." This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, "Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved." And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, "John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?' When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, 'Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life.'


Glory be to thee, O Lord

When he had gone out, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. This is the Gospel of the Lord.



Praise be to thee O Christ.

An organ fanfare sounds in honour of the Gospel, as the procession returns.

After the address, we pause briefly to reflect on what we've heard, then STAND for the Creed:

I believe in one God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible:

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by whom all things were made; who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven. and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead: whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spake by the prophets.

And I believe one holy catholic and apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins.

★ And I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The prayers of intercession follow:

We pray to Jesus, who is present with us to eternity.

The following response is used:

Jesus, Lord of life, in your mercy, hear us.

At the commemoration of the faithful departed:

Rest eternal grant unto them, O Lord and let light perpetual shine upon them. May they rest in peace and rise in glory.

The prayers end

Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen

Please STAND as the President introduces the Peace:

THE LITURGY OF THE SACRAMENT

Alleluia. Christ has been raised from the dead. Alleluia! The Peace of the risen Lord be always with you; and with thy spirit. Alleluia!

Let us offer each other a sign of Christ's Peace.

The Altar is prepared, during which we sing the Offertory hymn:

We pray thee, heavenly Father, to hear us in thy love, And pour upon thy children the unction from above; That so in love abiding, from all defilement free, We may in pureness offer our Eucharist to thee.

Be thou our guide and helper, O Jesus Christ, we pray; So may we well approach thee, if thou wilt be the Way: Thou, very Truth, hast promised to help us in our strife, Food of the weary pilgrim, eternal source of Life.

And thou, creator Spirit, look on us, we are thine; Renew in us thy graces, upon our darkness shine; That, with thy benediction upon our souls outpoured, We may receive in gladness the body of the Lord.

O Trinity of Persons, O Unity most high, On thee alone relying thy servants would draw nigh: Unworthy in our weakness, on thee our hope is stayed, And blessed by thy forgiveness we will not be afraid.


The president takes the bread and wine and says:

Be present, be present, Lord Jesus Christ, our risen high priest; make yourself known in the breaking of bread.

Amen.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice we offer for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Church.



The President continues the prayer, thanking God for all his saving works, and then invites the people to join their praises with the whole company of heaven:

(....and join their unending song of praise:)

The choir sings Sanctus and Benedictus:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

■ Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.


The President continues the prayer, repeating the Lord's own words over the bread and wine and asks the Father to send the Spirit on them to sanctify them. Then:

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The President continues the Eucharistic Prayer, joining our offering with Christ's sacrifice of himself. At the end:

..... in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.



Silence

Rejoicing in God's new creation, as our Saviour taught us we pray, in the language of our choice:

Our Father, who art in heaven,... Ein Tad, yr hwn wyt y nefoedd Notre père, qui es aux cieux..... 하늘에 계신 우리 아버지.... Vater unser, der du bist im Himmel.... Nna-ayi, Nke bi n'elu-igwe....

The President breaks the consecrated bread:

Jesus says, I am the bread of life, whoever eats this bread will live for ever.

Lord, our hearts hunger for you; give us this bread always.

The choir sings Agnus Dei:

Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: have mercy on us. Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world: grant us peace.

The President invites all to receive Holy Communion:

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia

Baptised persons who are communicant members of Churches subscribing to the Holy Trinity, may receive Holy Communion. To receive a blessing instead, come to the priest bringing this booklet with you. Please follow the direction of the stewards.

All taking part online are encouraged to make their Spiritual Communion, thus:

Lord Jesus Christ, grant, that as the hem of your garment, touched in faith, healed the woman who could not touch your body, so the soul of your servant may be healed by faith in you, whom I cannot now sacramentally receive; through your tender mercy, who lives and reigns with the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit ever one God, world without end. Amen.

During the administration, the choir sings the following motet:

Ubi caritas et amor, Deus ibi est. Congregavit nos in unum Christi amor. Exultemus, et in ipso iucundemur. Timeamus, et amemus Deum vivum. Et ex corde diligamus nos sincero. Amen.

[Where charity and love are, God is there. Christ's love has gathered us into one. Let us rejoice and be pleased in Him. Let us fear, and let us love the living God. And may we love each other with a sincere heart. Where charity and love are, God is there. Amen.]

Amen.

Any notices follow and we hear from Sunday and Crypt Clubs. Please then STAND.

We sing the final hymn, during which the Altar party processes to the west end:

O Jesus, I have promised to serve thee to the end; Be thou for ever near me, my Master and my Friend; I shall not fear the battle if thou art by my side, Nor wander from the pathway if thou wilt be my guide.

O let me hear thee speaking in accents clear and still, Above the storms of passion, the murmurs of self-will; O speak to reassure me, to hasten or control' O speak, and make me listen, thou guardian of my soul.

O Jesus, thou hast promised to all who follow thee,
